

## PATROL RULES 2009-10 SEASON

- Please make every effort to attend your rostered patrols.
- Please try to be punctual and plan to stay for the entire patrol.
- If you cannot attend a rostered patrol it is vital to:
  - Inform your Patrol Captain
  - Find a substitute with equal qualifications
  - Do a make up patrol, if possible, before your next rostered patrol.
- If you cannot find a sub, and are unable to attend a rostered patrol, no penalty will be applied as long as your Patrol Captain has been informed with enough time to replace you.
- SRC patrols. SRCs in the U14 age group to be rostered to 3 different patrols, allowing new SRC patrol members to experience different patrol structures and avoid clashes with Saturday training and carnivals.
- The “Nippers Group” will complete their patrol obligations by assisting Juniors with watercover and other Juniors duties. If you are signed on for Juniors Duties, you **must** be available to assist with Juniors activities from 1330 – 1600.
- A failure to report for a rostered patrol will result in a penalty patrol being applied. This will be in addition to a make up patrol.
- The Patrol Captain and Vice Captain are in charge of the patrol.
- Any problems arising during a patrol should be firstly dealt with within the Patrol Group.

- All patrolling members must be paid up before 30<sup>th</sup> November and proficient prior to 31<sup>st</sup> December in order to maintain patrol and competition status.
- **Full Patrol uniform must be worn. This includes patrol cap, bathers (preferably club bathers or red bathers that are designed for competition/training. No boardies or “fashion statements” please) and DHL patrol uniform. It’s fine to wear wetsuits, rashies etc when in the water, but patrol cap and regulation bathers must still be worn. Full DHL uniform must be worn when not in the water.**
